Content Description

Recognise how language shapes relationships and roles. (AC9E8LA01)

VR Learning Activities

Listening and Understanding:

Students listen to the tutor as the information shifts from informal slang to formal academic language when a teacher enters the room. They identify how tone, word choice, and phrasing change depending on the relationship and context.

Interactive Exploration:

Students engage in a role-play activity where they take on different social roles (friend, teacher, principal, coach) and practice adjusting their language accordingly. They also explore a virtual timeline matching slang terms from different decades to their meanings, reflecting how group identity evolves through language.

Questioning and Critical Thinking:

Students answer questions such as: "Why do we change the way we speak around different people?" and "How does language create a sense of belonging in different groups?" These questions encourage students to reflect on their own use of language and how it influences social roles and relationships.

Key Learning Areas

Language Variation and Context: Understanding how language use shifts depending on audience, purpose, and social roles.

Group Identity and Communication: Exploring how specific language (e.g., slang, acronyms) fosters connection and a sense of belonging within groups.

Social Awareness in Language Use: Recognising the influence of relationships and social roles on the tone and formality of language.

Historical and Generational Language Change: Investigating how slang and informal language evolve over time and across generations.

Critical Thinking about Language: Reflecting on personal language choices and the broader impact of language on relationships and identity.
